What is Prop 484?

This proposition would amend the City Charter to add more city-owned properties to the list of properties already protected from being sold, leased, or developed. These lands would remain open space or recreation areas unless voters approve a change in a future election.

What does a “YES” vote mean?

A “YES” vote shall have the effect of adding language to the Prescott City Charter adding several city-owned properties, prohibiting the sale, lease or transfer of such properties and requiring such properties (in accordance with Resolution No. 2025-1914 adopted by the City Council on March 25, 2025 and on file with the City Clerk) be retained by the city with use limitations in conformance with pre-existing and/or other limited specified uses consistent with open space in perpetuity unless an exception is approved by a majority of votes cast by Prescott registered voters at a primary, general or special election.

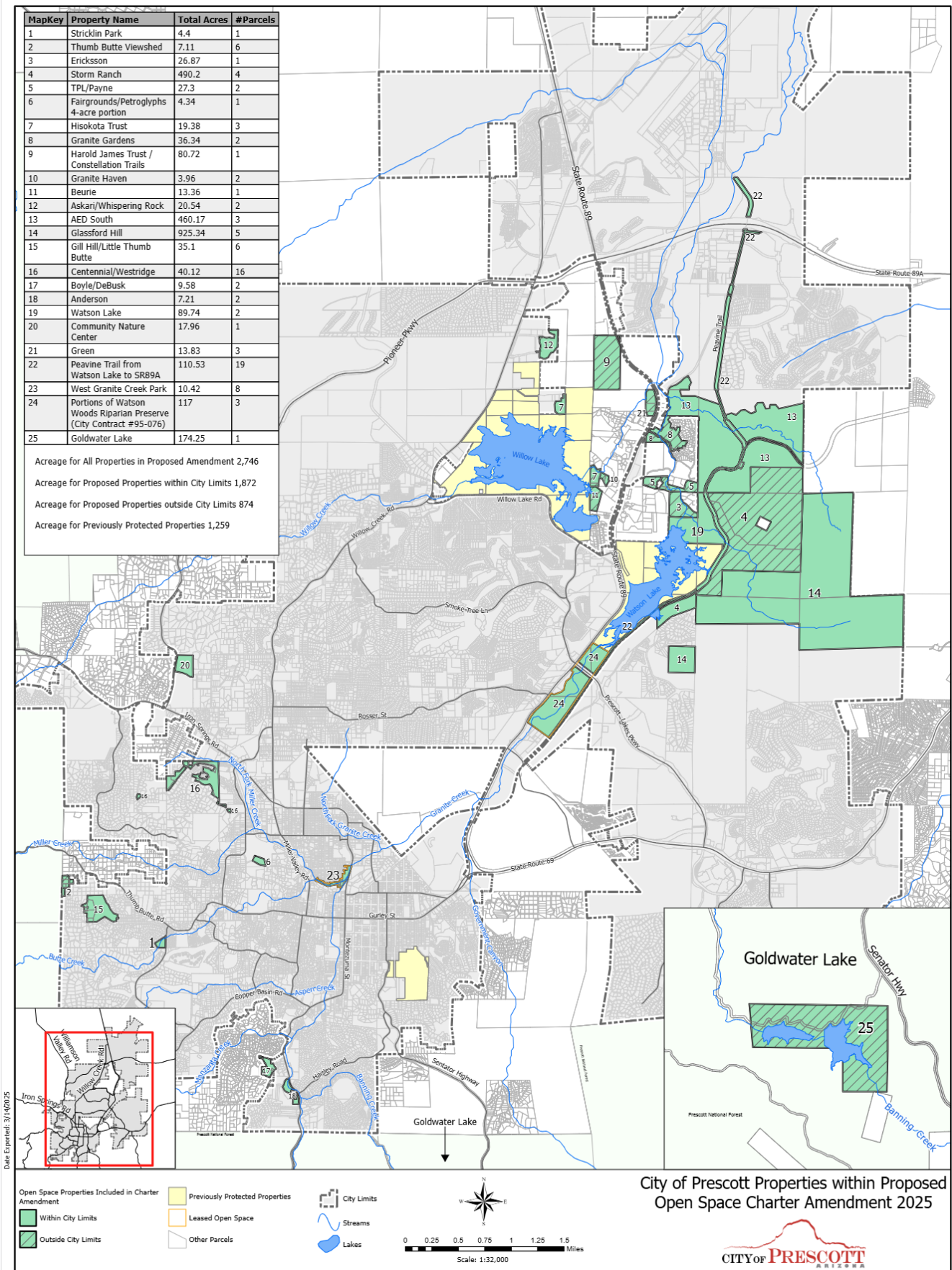
What does a “NO” vote mean?
